<u>District Emergency Communication Procedures & Protocols</u> <u>Commack School District</u>

During an emergency situation, Commack Schools will use the following channels to communicate with stakeholders:

- Website posting(s)
- E-mail message(s)
- Recorded telephone message(s)
- Text message(s)
- Media Communication (radio and/or television announcements)

Serious Incidents:

For those situations such as those listed below, all available communication methods listed above will be used to communicate with parents:

- External Emergencies: Weather related closings, chemical incidents, school lockdowns due to external police activities, significant criminal misconduct (as legally permissible)
- Internal Emergencies: Building issues including fire, smoke, unplanned evacuation to another site, intruders (sheltering procedure or lockdown necessary), bomb threats, shootings, weapons, intruder (based on police recommendation)

Moderate Incidents:

For those situations such as those listed below, the following forms of communication will be utilized: website posting, e-mail, and depending on the circumstances, a telephone call (optional), and/or text (optional):

- External Emergencies: weather-related early dismissal, cancellation of after-school activities, death of a staff member, stranger alert, etc.
- Internal Emergencies: power outage, phone and/or internet outages, temporary evacuation of building, flood, bus accidents

Informational Matters:

For situations such as those listed below, the following forms of communication will be utilized: Website posting, e-mail and/or text (optional)

 Matters that Significantly Disrupt the Learning Process or Operation of the School/Rumor Control: Disciplinary matters, matters involving the police that cause a disruption of the learning process and/or school day, other matters as identified by the administration Biological/Disease/Health issues: (dependent on severity as determined by administration)
 i.e. Pertussis – follow building delineated procedures; other diseases, the director of nursing will
 issue guidance on communication(s) related to other diseases, some of which are guided by the
 Suffolk County Department of Health

Death of a Student:

 Dependent upon parental wishes and legal guidelines and/or other matters as determined by the administration

Change of Scheduled Event:

- Immediate (within 24 hours): e-mail, text, telephone message, posting on website
- Future date: e-mail, posting on website or calendar
- Include in principal's newsletter or other written communication to homes

Police and/or Other Emergency Personnel Involved:

• Some situations require police and/or other emergency personnel involvement, guidance and/or intervention and are related to situations that the District will not broadcast.
