Senior Citizens and Disability Low Income Tax Exemption

New York State Real Property Tax Law amended § 467 and 459-c to increase the income ceiling from \$37,400 to \$58,400. Gives option to School Districts to "opt in" to grant the increased income levels to Senior Citizens and Disabled residents.

If adopted, Senior Citizens and Disabled residents would see reduction to annual school tax bill from Towns of Huntington and Smithtown.

Firefighter and Ambulance Workers Tax Exemption


New York State recently enacted RPTL 466-a, which authorizes school districts to permit an exemption for fire departments and ambulance workers. The provisions of the new law, are summarized as follows:

- Be exempt from taxation to the extent of ten (10) percent of the assessed value of the property for school district purposes
- Minimum service requirements are 2 years
- Twenty (20) years of active service or more will be granted ten (10%) percent exemption for life.
- An un-remarried spouse of a deceased firefighter to continue the exemption if the recipient had been enrolled for at least 20 years, (five (5) years if killed in the line of duty)

The Commack Educational Program Continuum





Academic Intervention Services








New York State Literacy Initiative
