Junior-Year Focus

- SAT/ACT

Transcript



- 1 of several components of a complete application
- What do colleges look for?... Rigorous course load throughout high school, well-rounded curriculum, and GROWTH!
- Your transcript can be viewed in Campus Backpack; and you will receive an updated transcript during the summer before 12th grade with final junior grades and updated GPA

Test Optional vs. Test Blind

- **Test optional** when a college allows applicants to decide whether to submit SAT or ACT scores as part of their application
- **Test blind-**when a college does not look at SAT/ACT scores, even if a students submits them
- Many schools have adopted these policies for the 22-23 admissions cycle. Many schools have already announced that they will keep this policy for the 23-24 cycle. Check the college website for the most up-to-date information!

Letters of Recommendation

- Recommendation letters from Counselor (1) and teachers (2)
- Students should request letters of recommendation from their teachers in person, in the spring of Junior year
- Following a personal request, students submit their request electronically through Naviance
- Students provide their recommenders with the completed Teacher Recommendation Request Form
- For Counselor letters of recommendation, please complete Autobiography, Resume, and Parent Feedback before the end of 11th grade.

Activity Resume & CSIP

- A student's resume is vitally important in the application process.
- BRAG ABOUT YOURSELF, PLEASE!!
- What to include: extracurricular activities in school (clubs, sports, honor societies etc.), volunteer work, paid work experience, leadership experiences, internships, summer programs, honors/awards, etc.
- CSIP- please make every effort to complete CSIP hours each year. There are many opportunities for points available! CSIP website: https://www.commackschools.org/csip.aspx Be sure to include all on your resume!

It's all about balance...

- Identify schools that you consider:
 - A Safety School-your scores and grades surpass all academic and extracurricular requirements at these schools.
 - A Target School- your grades and scores are within the middle 50% of accepted students.
 - A Reach or 'Dream' School- your grades and scores may be below the middle 50% of students attending these schools.

Your list of schools should include a mix of all three ©

Application Types

Early Decision: Legally binding agreement with college stating student must attend, if accepted. Deadlines are earlier, typically November 1 or 15, but this varies by school.

Early Action: Non-binding, students applies early, meeting an early deadline, but has until May 1 to commit/decide. Deadlines are typically November 1 or 15, but this varies by school.

Regular Decision: Decisions are made after deadline date has lapsed. Most decision letters are mailed in early April.

Rolling Admissions: First come, first served. Applications are processed as they 'roll' in and decision is quickly 'rolled' back to student.

Single Choice Early Action: A few of the most competitive colleges offer this non-binding admission policy. Students may apply to a single choice college, however, they are not permitted to apply to other schools using the EA/ED option during this period. Details vary by school.
