


Between 2016 and 2020 the number of IB Programs offered worldwide has grown by 33.3%




IB Diploma & Certificate Programmes

Types of Courses

STANDARD LEVEL COURSES (SL)

These classes are either 1 or 2 year courses. Don't let "standard level" deceive you, they are still challenging courses.

HIGHER LEVEL COURSES (HL)

These classes must be offered as 2 year courses. These courses go more in depth than SL courses.

BOTH levels are considered rigorous coursework at the collegiate level!

Given within the span of the course by the teacher. The teacher grades this portion and we send in samples to the IB to moderate our scores (make sure they are accurate).	Given in May at the conclusion of the course . These exams are given in a testing environment outside of class. They are graded by the IB.	In early July of the testing year, the scores are released. These scores are sent to the appropriate college/university on file for the candidates.

Full IB Diploma vs. National Cohort




Figure 4. Four-year graduation rates by institution type
