SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT PROVISIONS

School Responsibilities

The **Commack High School** will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

By providing reading, writing and math instruction which focus on phonics, reading comprehension, and writing skills, and math concepts/skills. Lessons are developed based on the child's individual needs. Instruction is coordinated with and supplemental to the regular classroom program. The purpose of the additional instruction is to improve the child's skills and strategies.

2. Make available teachers and support staff to engage with parents and guardians regarding their child's individual progress.

Staff are available for parents via email, phone, and for conference upon request. Contact Information can be found on the district webpage.

Commack High School offers more than a dozen events during the evening for parents and students to engage in conversation about various programs. These events are communicated via email and are posted on the district website/calendar.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

Parent reports relating to Title I academic support services will coincide with school report cards quarterly. Related progress, if any, reports will be included with classroom report cards separately. Families also have access to the live grade book via the Parent Portal, which is accessible anytime.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

Staff may be reached via email or telephone on any school day. Conferences may be scheduled via telephone and/or in person at the mutual convenience of parents and staff members.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

Class and school-wide events take place throughout the school year. Invitations for these events are sent to the parents indicating a time and date. Invitations can be found on the district calendar or are sent via email or robocall.

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

Parents will support their children's learning, by:

- Monitoring the attendance of their children.
- Ensuring that assignments are completed.
- Monitor the amount of television children watch and how much time is spent with other technologies such as tablets and smartphones.
- Volunteering in their child's classroom.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.
- Serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as SBMT, PTA, and Title I Parent Advisory Group.
