IV. NEW BUSINESS

Motion by Mr. Hartman, seconded by Mr. Behar and carried unanimously to adopt the resolution regarding the Smart Schools Investment Plan.

WHEREAS, the Commack Union Free School District approved a preliminary Smart Schools Investment Plan on April 7, 2016, pursuant to the Smart Schools Bond Act (the “Act”); and

WHEREAS, the preliminary Smart Schools Investment Plan was posted on the District’s website for at least 30 days, and the District included an address to which any written comments on the preliminary Smart School Investment Plan should be sent; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education conducted a public hearing that enabled stakeholders to respond to the preliminary Smart Schools Investment Plan, for which adequate notice of the public hearing was provided through local media and the District website for at least two weeks prior to the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has considered all public comments, completed a final Smart School Investment Plan, and determined that approval of the final Smart School Investment Plan is in the best interest of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the final Smart Schools Investment Plan to complete School Connectivity (\$880,314), Classroom Technology (\$826,610), and High Tech Security Features (\$500,000) as more fully described in the District Plan is hereby approved.
