




# Legislative Advocacy Committee Update

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The Legislative Advocacy Committee (LAC) was established to assist the Board of Education in implementing solutions regarding legislative matters. LAC is composed of the Superintendent of Schools, Board of Education members, Commack residents, High School students, and members of the Commack staff. The committee centers its efforts on assessing the impact of existing and proposed State and Federal education legislation, promoting legislation that supports the District's mission, and communicating vital information to our residents. Further, the committee is charged with effectively communicating Commack's needs to our local, State, and Federally elected representatives.

Last week, LAC held its first meeting of the year and welcomed multiple new students, staff, and resident members. The group reviewed current platforms and hopes to add and amend ideas in the upcoming months while looking ahead to their yearly Albany trip in March.
