Policy Update: Workplace Violence Prevent Policy

Why and What?

Revisions to Labor Law Section 27-b <u>no longer exempt school districts</u> from the related requirements of Workplace Violence Prevention originally enacted in 2006. Therefore, school districts are now <u>required</u> to:



How, By Who, and By When?

To meet these requirements:

The BOE will consider a proposed policy for adoption

The Office of Human Resources, with support from related departments, will:

Conduct a risk Evalution, by March 4
Develop a workplace prevention program by March 19

Comply with remaining regulations by May 3

Corresponding regulations will be developed by the administration
