Curriculum and Instruction

Student engagement is enhanced via the implementation of a challenging, supportive and reflective instructional program.

- All students participate in the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme.
- The MYP Programme reflects a framework for teaching and learning.
 - Inquiry based and student centered
 - Skill Development- Research, Social, Thinking, Communication and Self-Management

Enrichment Classes

Student engagement is enhanced via enrichment classes, Regents level courses and exploration of world language beginning in grade 6.

- Grade 7 and 8 students have 13 enrichment classes to choose from:
 - E.g.- world activists, robotics, forensics, gaming and coding, etc.
 - Authentic learning tasks/ application.
- The study of world language begins in grade 6 with either Spanish, French or Italian

Regents Level Course Work

Student engagement is enhanced via enrichment classes, Regents level courses and exploration of world language beginning in grade 6.

- Grade 8 students enroll in Regents level Earth Science or Living Environment and potentially Algebra I
- Students begin to study a World Language (French, Spanish or Italian) beginning in grade 6

Counseling Center & Other Supports

- (7) School counselors, (2) Social workers and (5) School Psychologists.
- Weekly grade level meetings (teachers & support staff)
- Instructional support team meetings
- Push in programming/ Assembly programming:
 - The Power of Language, Digital Footprint, Mindfulness, Internet Safety, Too Good for Drugs, Building your Brand, Disabilities Awareness, Bullying Prevention, Voices from the Fire, etc.
- Transition Planning (grade 5-6 and 8-9)
- New entrant programming
- Other

Intramurals and Athletics

Student engagement is enhanced via participation in the athletics program.

- Inviting, child-centered environment designed to develop balanced, caring and principled student-athletes.
- Grade 7-8 (22) different sports offered over 4 seasons.
- Daily intramurals for all grade levels before school.

Fine and Applied Arts

Student engagement is enhanced through a robust music and art program.

- Students have the opportunity to participate in general music, band, orchestra and/or chorus.
- Music and art clubs further develop student talents and interests.
- (2) annual concerts
- The Music & Art Department orchestrates a number of special events throughout the year (Jazz night, Festival of the arts, String night).

PBIS and Fostering Positive Relationships

Student engagement is enhanced via the implementation of an evidence based school wide approach to acknowledging positive behavior that creates a safe and welcoming learning environment.

- The PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports) model provides consistent messaging related to the values of respect, responsibility and fostering positive relationships.
- Behavior matrix and common language

- PAW system to acknowledge students

Clubs

Student enfranchisement into the school community is enhanced through a robust catalogue of clubs.

- Clubs support intellectual, physical and social development





Combining international programs and experiential learning to provide our students with unparalleled learning experiences


- Comprehensive educational program that focuses on interconnectedness between subjects with an international mindset


