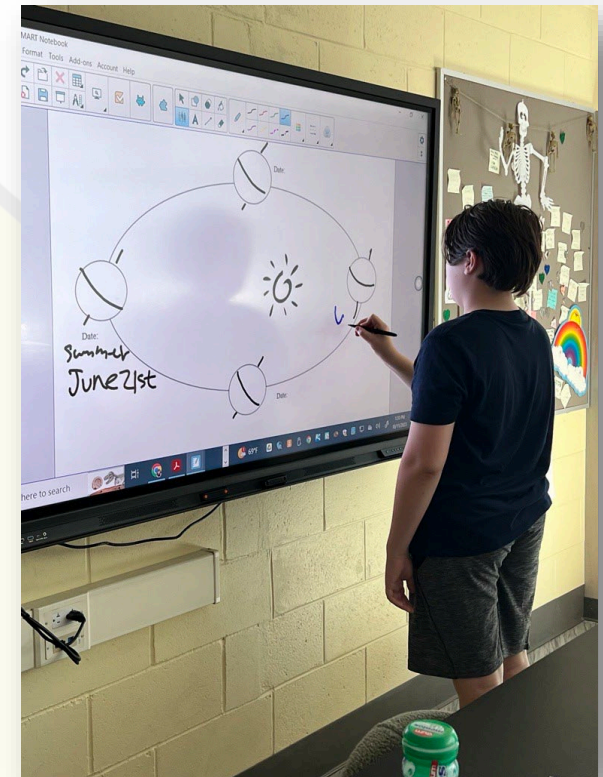

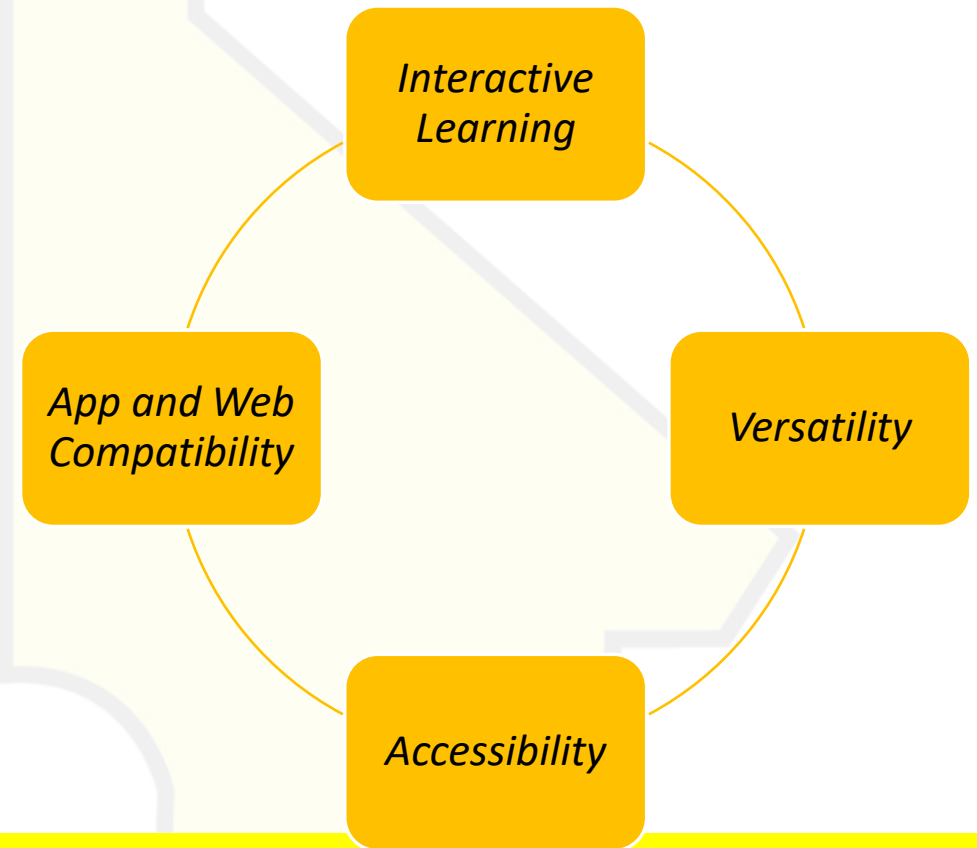
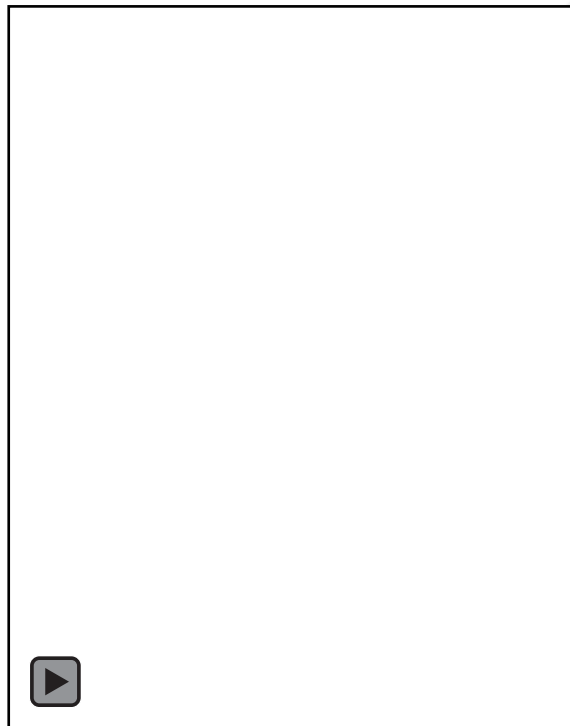

New Outer Perimeter Security Assignments

Security begins at the outer perimeter, so we added additional security vehicles that start at CMS, Burr, Sawmill, and all Primary Schools.

These additional outer perimeter assignments begin to also cover SCOPE arrivals.

This initiative dramatically enhances the omnipresence at the buildings and provides a point of information for visitors.



New Door Ajar Security Enhancement

Door Ajar system has been installed at the middle and high schools.

Real time alerts are immediately sent to a fixed group of individuals whenever an exterior door is opened.

Security Guards

Commack School District currently employs 73 Full and Part-time Security Guards. (68 have prior or are active members of law enforcement).

ALL Guards must:

Possess an active New York State Security Guards license

Attend a mandatory 8-hour annual In-Service Training Course

Be CPR/AED and "Stop the Bleed" trained

Be trained on the Incident Command System (ICS)

Be instructed on general guidelines/procedures/policies

Work closely with the administrative staff to discuss and review the assigned buildings' overall security

Complete the District's GCN training each year

Our Security Team's experience allows each of them to quickly identify and address any situation that should arise. Safety and Security is a constant discussion, each day security is faced with challenges and as a team everyone works together to make this a safe and secure environment.

Emergency Response Plans

District-Wide Emergency Response Plan is posted on our website and is available for the public.

Each building within the District has a comprehensive Building Emergency Response Plan that is submitted to the State of New York annually for review. These building plans are confidential and are not available for public review.

Security: Building Specifics

Security staff monitor the only entrance available to the public.

CHS, CMS, Burr and Sawmill have security vestibules which keep all visitors out of the interior of the building until Security admits.

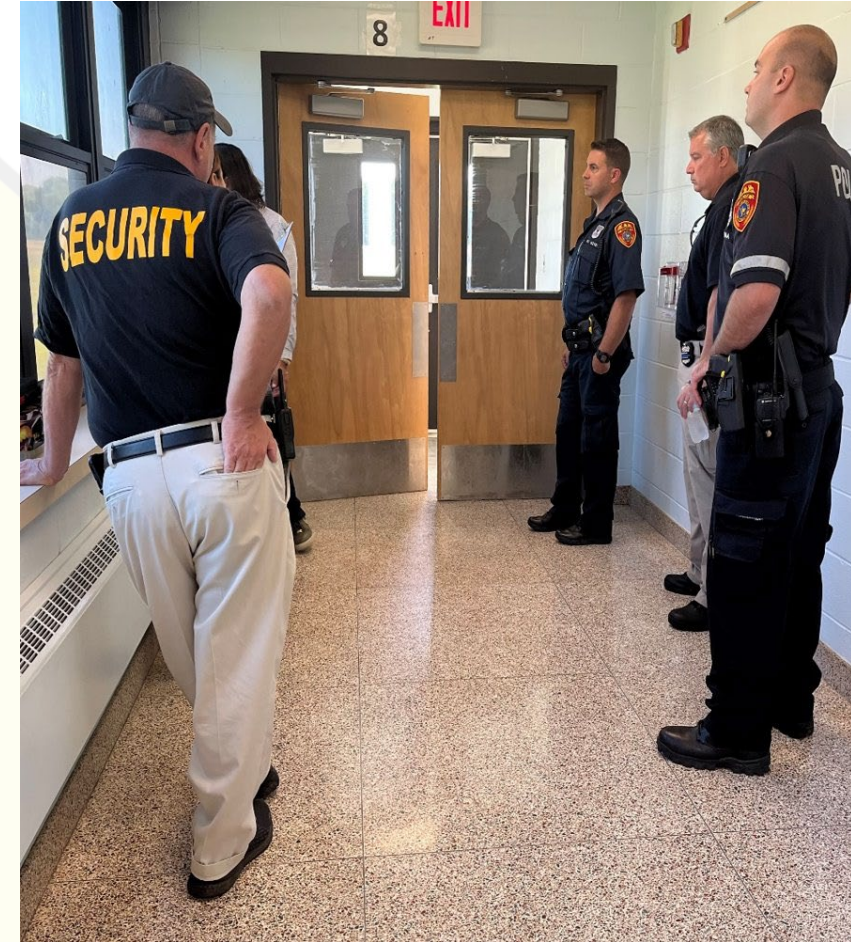
The Primary buildings are equipped with pass-through windows which also limits building entry.

Security staff routinely checks to ensure all areas of egress are secured.

Security Assessment

Conducted a District-Wide assessment for Commack School District.

Police personnel, administration, and security have walked each building to review policies, procedures and protocols that are currently in place.

Drill Procedures

We perform conventional, as well as non-conventional drills. We do not perform the same basic drills with the check the box attitude. Drills are conducted to prepare for an emergency.



Situational awareness is extremely important so it is discussed before, during, and after drills.

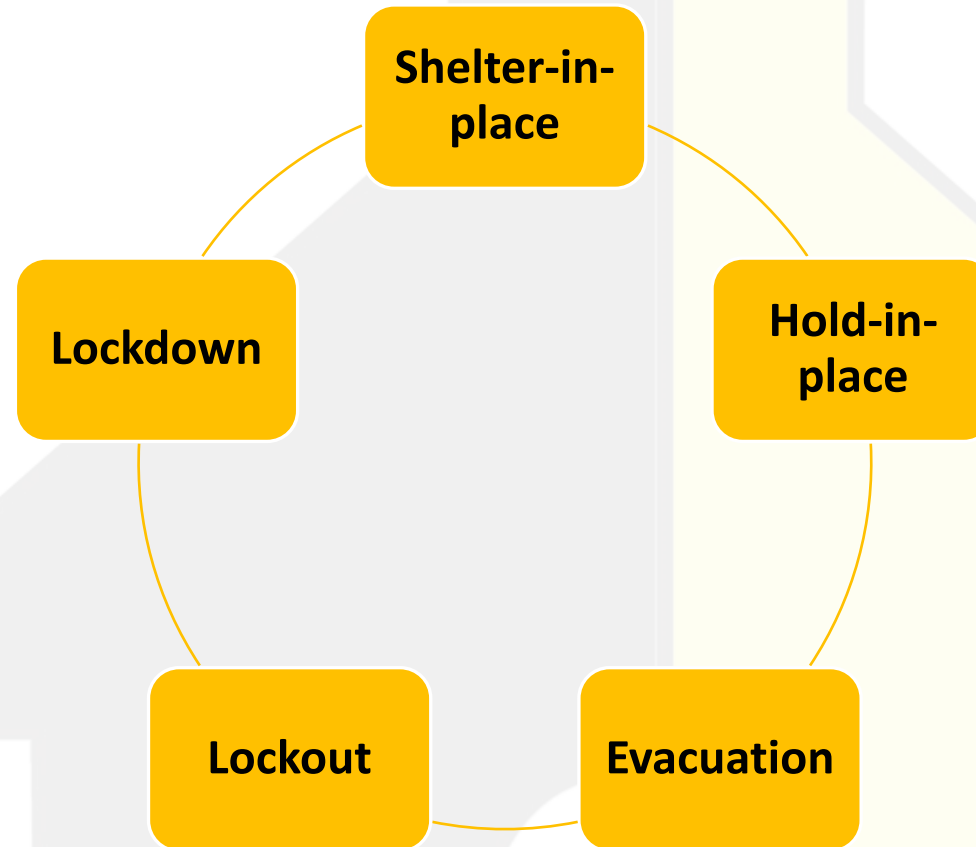


A hot wash, or critique is conducted after each drill.



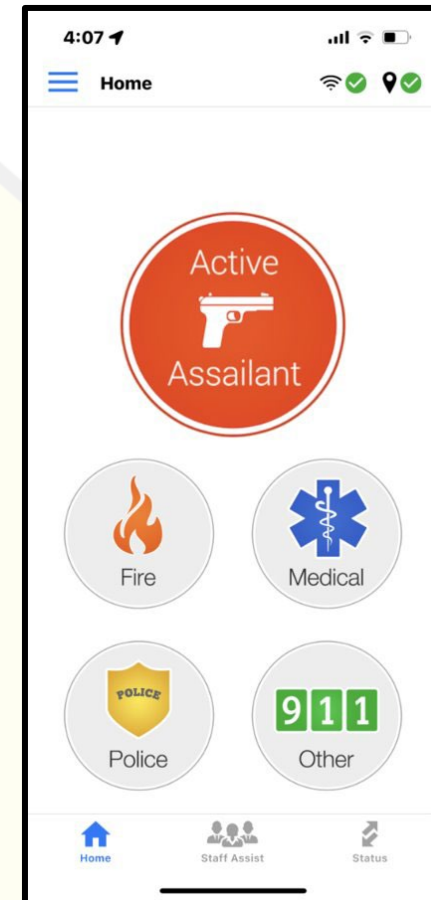
Problems are identified and corrected as needed. After each drill the District (first responders, administrative staff, students, and security personnel) discuss, correct and determine solutions to any identified problems.

Legislative Advocacy Committee Update



The Legislative Advocacy Committee (LAC) was established to assist the Board of Education in implementing solutions regarding legislative matters. The committee is charged with effectively communicating Commack's needs to our local, state, and federal elected representatives.

The Legislative Advocacy Committee is comprised of the Superintendent of Schools, Board of Education members, Commack residents, High School students, Commack staff, members from the collective bargaining units and community members.
