Commack Middle School Guide Book for Families



This document contains answers to many of the questions you may have about Commack Middle School. Remember, you can always talk to any Teacher, School Counselor, Administrator or any staff member if you need any assistance.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

The Middle School is divided into teams amongst the grade levels. The teachers and counselors of each team meet together weekly to discuss academics and/or social issues as they relate to individual students and entire classes. All educators work collaboratively with mental health staff, administrators, and parents to ensure that the developmental, social, emotional and academic needs of individual students are met.

All students at Commack Middle School learn through the Middle Years Program (MYP). MYP provides a framework of academic challenge that allows students to connect what they learn in school to the outside world, thereby producing a culture of global-minded learners. The MYP is focused on encouraging students to become critical and reflective thinkers. The Middle Years Program is inclusive and focused on every child. The MYP is designed to help students find a sense of belonging in this ever-changing and increasingly interrelated world and to foster their positive attitude toward learning.

1. Courses

• Main Academic Classes:

Main academic classes include: English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language. These classes are located in a designated area of the school depending on which "house" your child is assigned to. 6th grade students will be assigned to the "E" house, and 7th and 8th grade students will be assigned to either the "C" house or "D" house. Students will have the opportunity to select a world language class beginning in 6th grade. Students have the option to study Spanish, Italian, or French.

• Homeroom:

Homeroom is the same location as first period and a time for students to take care of errands they may have within the school. Daily announcements will be shared during homeroom. If students miss the announcements, they can access them by clicking here: <u>CMS Announcements</u>.

• Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO):

ELO is a scheduled class where independent work takes place. Students should take advantage of the opportunity to complete work or tasks associated with curricular courses. Students will have designated time for independent work and independent reading.

• Wheel (Art, Family Consumer Science, Health, Technology):

Students will be enrolled in four classes throughout the school year, taking one of each class every day and rotating each quarter. Students will take each wheel class during each school year.

• Enrichment:

Students in 7th and 8th grade may have the opportunity to take an enrichment class. These courses meet every other day for the entire year, are project-based, and include curricula that meet the needs of different learners within the same class. • Music:

Students are able to choose which music class they would like to participate in. Students can choose to take Band, Chorus, Orchestra, or General Music. Students who are in Band or Orchestra and would like to participate in Chorus, will have the option to take Lunch Chorus.

2. Extra Help

All teachers offer extra help. Extra help time and day is determined by each classroom teacher. Morning extra help begins at 7:15am. Afternoon extra help begins directly after school until 3:30pm. Students should check with each teacher to find out when their extra help is offered.

3. Passes to Leave Class

Students who need to leave the classroom for any reason, should ask their teacher for a pass. The teacher will write and sign a pass that will then be verified when they arrive at their destination. When they leave their destination a pass will be issued to show their teacher when they return to class.

4. Bathrooms

Bathrooms are located in each "house" of the building. Each "house" has a boys and girls restroom. Single stall restrooms are located in the "C" house and by the cafeteria.

5. Chromebooks

Every student at Commack Middle School has their own Chromebook for school use. The Chromebook should be brought to school each day and home each afternoon as students will need it at both places. Students should treat their Chromebook like any other school-issued item and take care of it. If issues arise with their Chromebook, our dedicated Instructional Technology staff is available to assist them. Chromebook help is available throughout the school day. Ask your homeroom teacher or school counselor where to go for help.

6. Clubs and Activities

The middle school offers a variety of clubs to all its students. A list of clubs is posted on our website and can be accessed by clicking here: <u>Clubs & Activities</u>. Students who wish to join a club should listen to the PA announcements for that club's meeting time and place, then plan to attend the meeting. Clubs offered include areas of interest in Art, Music, Honor Societies (application required), Nature & Animals, Athletics, Creativity & Writing.

LOCKERS

1. Finding your Locker

Lockers are assigned throughout the school on both the first and second floors. Lockers are numbered by house and individual locker number. Student's locker information can be found at the bottom of their schedule.

2. Issues with your Locker

Students who are having trouble opening their locker should not worry. Locker repair forms are available on each teachers' Google Classroom or can be found by clicking here: Locker Repair Form. Students should complete the form and our staff will assist in ensuring the locker is working appropriately. Students who have trouble with their combination, should speak with their School Counselor.

3. Sharing Lockers

Lockers are a secure space to keep personal belongings. Students are not permitted to share their locker or combination with anyone.

4. Gym Lockers

Gym lockers will be assigned by students' physical education teachers at the beginning of the school year. Gym lockers are a secure space to keep personal belongings while in physical education. Students should secure their belongings in their gym locker, and not on a bench or the floor of the locker room. The locker room is not locked and multiple classes have access to the space.





LUNCH & THE CAFETERIA

1. Student Lunches/ "Split" Lunch Program:

Students will be assigned a lunch period noted as either "Gold" or "White" on their schedules

• Students with "Gold" Designation:

- Will report to the cafeteria for the first part of the period in order to participate in food service/lunch.
- After approximately 20 minutes, students with the "Gold" designation will report to recess/recreation.

• Students with "White" Designation:

- Will report directly to recess/recreation.
- After approximately 20 minutes, students with the "White" designation will report to the cafeteria to participate in food service/lunch.

Please note that student lunch assignments will not change throughout the year.

2. Seating

Students will have the opportunity to adjust their "Gold" or "White" designation, after the conclusion of the first week of school. The process for doing so will be discussed with students during their assigned lunch period. If approved, parents/guardians will be notified via school messenger regarding changes to their child's schedule.

Students interested in a quiet space to read or complete school work will be permitted to report to the cafeteria, rather than outdoor recreation/recess. This location will be supervised by middle school staff and presents an additional option for students.

3. Lunch Chorus

The Lunch Chorus program will commence toward the end of September. Students enrolled in the Lunch Chorus program will report to the Chorus Room (A-9) during their designated "Recess" time. (see table above).

4. Purchasing Lunch

Students may charge their lunch at any time. Students will be provided with a school lunch card with a barcode to present at the cafeteria registers.

5. Library & Computer Lab Passes

It is expected that students will remain in the Cafeteria for their entire lunch period. However, if a student would like to go to the Library or Computer Lab they will need a pass/staff approval to do so:

• Library - if space permits, students may go to the Library during lunch, students will need a pass. Passes can be obtained the morning of lunch from the receptionist in the Library. • Computer Lab - if space permits, students can obtain a pass to either the "E" House, "D" House, or "C" House computer lab. Passes for any of the computer labs can be obtained by visiting the computer lab during homeroom. Students will report to the computer lab <u>after</u> they eat (food is not permitted in any computer lab).

ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL & EARLY PICK UP

1. Entrance to School

There are three main entrances to Commack Middle School based on the way your child arrives to school:

- Students who take the bus to school will enter through the back of the building.
- Students who take a van to school will enter through the west side of the building, by the "E" House.
- Students who get driven to school will enter through the front of the building.

2. Late Arrive

For students who are arriving to school after the school day has started, please follow these steps:

- 1. Student's parent/guardian should write a note explaining the lateness and when the student arrives at school they should hand it to the Attendance staff.
- 2. Students will be issued a late pass to provide to their teacher and their attendance in Infinite Campus will be updated.
- 3. Students will report directly to their scheduled class based on the time they arrive at CMS.

3. Early Dismissal

For students who are leaving before the end of the scheduled school day:

- 1. Student's parent/guardian will go to the Main Office window ("the bubble") to request that the student be excused from school. Parents/guardians must provide photo ID to security upon arrival.
- 2. Students will be called to the bubble and officially released when their parent/guardian has signed them out.
- 3. Students who return before the end of the school day, are to go directly to the Main Office window to be readmitted.

DISMISSAL FROM SCHOOL

1. Exits

After the last bell, students are expected to exit the building unless they are staying after for an organized club/school activity or athletic practice/contest. Students may use any exterior door to exit the building. Students who are riding the bus will find buses in two rows in the back of the building. There is an order that is posted by the back doors. Students who are being picked-up can arrange for their ride to meet them in the front of the building.

2. Temporary Bus Passes

Students wishing to obtain an alternate bus pass should report with a written note from a parent/guardian to their house office or Counseling Center during homeroom. Transportation will be contacted and the student will be informed if they are permitted to ride on a different bus for the day. The student will be able to contact their parent/guardian if there is no space available.

3. Late Buses

For students who stay after and would like to take the late bus home, transportation will be available. Late buses have been scheduled at approximately 3:40 and 5:00pm to transport children who have stayed late at school to participate in extra-help classes, clubs, activities, or athletic events. Please be advised that the late buses make fewer stops than the regular bus. Bus stops are not the same as the daily buses; Middle School late buses are A,B,C,D. Late Buses leave from the front of the building. Stops for each route are posted by the Main Office window ("the bubble"), Counseling Center, and rear the front and back doors. Students who are being picked-up can arrange for their ride to meet them in the back of the building.
