#### **At the beginning of the year, most students will need:**

#### **At the beginning of the year, most students will need:**

- a binder or notebook. We suggest purchasing 5 individual poly binders, one for each academic subject **OR** 2 large (2") 3-ring binders (preferably D-ring as they're more durable), one for morning classes and one for afternoon classes, etc.
- 3 sets of section dividers.
- #2 pencils (you'll need two or more to start).
- black- or blue-ink pens (you'll need two or more to start).
- a pen in a contrasting color (red, green, etc.) to the pen used regularly.
- highlighters (two or more to start).
- two-pocket folders (4 to 6).
- a ruler with inches and centimeters or a straight edge
- loose-leaf, 3-holed paper.
- tissues for personal use.
- graph paper (for 7th and 8th graders only).
- either** a TI-30XIIS scientific calculator for all students in grade 6 and 7 and students in Math 8 **or** a TI-84 Plus Graphing Calculator for students taking grade 8 Algebra 1

#### **Suggested items to be kept at home:**

- markers, colored pencils, and crayons.
- stapler, staples, and staple remover.
- scissors.
- glue sticks.
- a flash drive for transporting computer work between home and school.
- extra loose-leaf paper.
