
Cougar Questions & Answers



This booklet contains answers to many of the questions you may have about Commack High School. Remember, you can always talk to any Teacher, School Counselor, Administrator or any staff member if you need any assistance.

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ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL, ABSENCES AND EARLY RELEASE

ENTRANCE TO SCHOOL

There are three main entrances to Commack High School based on the way you get to school:

- *If you take the bus* you will enter through the Main Lobby doors in the Bus Loop or through the South Gymnasium doors
- *If you get a ride* you will enter through the Cafeteria on Townline Road or through the E-Wing Lobby.
- If you are a Senior who drives you will enter through the E-Wing lobby

The doors above will be the only ones that are open during arrival times. The Cafeteria doors will be closed and locked at 7:30am. The E-Wing doors will be closed and locked at the end of the arrival time. Any entrance into the building after 1st period should be through the Main Lobby.

ABSENCES/LATE ARRIVE/EARLY RELEASE

For students who will be absent for a full day of school please call the CHS Attendance Office at 631-912-2112. The Attendance Office has a 24 hour voicemail. If you leave a message please include your child's name, grade, and date of absence, and reason for absence(s).

For students who are arriving to school after the school day has started, please follow these steps:

- 1. Please have your parent/guardian write a note explaining the lateness and hand that in to the Attendance staff in the Main Lobby.
- 2. You will be issued a late pass to provide to your teacher and your attendance in Infinite Campus will be updated.
- 3. Go directly to your scheduled class based on the time that you arrive at CHS.

For students who are leaving before the end of the scheduled school day:

- 1. Please have your parent/guardian write a note explaining the release. This must be done ahead of time as we cannot call into a classroom to release the student.
- 2. Hand in your note to one of the following locations:
 - o Main Lobby
 - o Cafeteria (before school only)
- 3. The Attendance staff will contact your parent/guardian to verify the release and you will be issued a release pass to provide to your teacher. Your attendance in Infinite Campus will be updated.
- 4. At the time of your release, show your pass to your classroom teacher and then proceed to the Main Office to sign out.



SENIOR PARKING

Parking on our campus is a senior privilege and we would like to extend this opportunity to any senior who is eligible. In order to obtain a Senior Parking Sticker, Seniors must attend the Driver Safety Program and be up-to-date with their CSIP hours. LOCKERS

FINDING YOUR LOCKER

Lockers are assigned throughout the school on both the first and second floors. Lockers are numbered by wing and individual locker number. At the end of each hallway is a brown plaque that will tell you which locker numbers are located in that hallway. There are also color-coded maps around the building that will show you the locations of lockers.



ISSUES WITH YOUR LOCKER

If you have trouble opening your locker, please do not worry, our staff can assist you. If your locker is jammed, please report this to the Dean's Office. If you have trouble with your combination, please speak with your School Counselor.



SHARING LOCKERS

Your locker is your secure space to keep your personal belongings, so please do not share your locker or combination with anyone.



GYM LOCKERS

Your gym locker is your secure space to keep your personal belongings while you are in physical education. Please be sure to secure your belongings in your gym locker, and not on a bench or the floor of the locker room. The locker room is not locked and multiple classes have access to the space.





SCHEDULED CLASSES

LOCATIONS

Generally, classes are scheduled based on the subject being taught:

- Art/Music Classes Music wing and classrooms that start with "A"
- World Language Classes Lower A wing and upper A-wing
- English Classes Lower C and E-wing
- Math Classes Lower and upper E-wing
- Social Studies Classes Upper C and E-wing
- Science Classes Upper A, B & D-wing
- Physical Education & Health Classes Gymnasiums and lower Ewing





Study Halls are quiet rooms where low conversation can take place between students. Students should take advantage of the opportunity to complete work or tasks associated with curricular courses or extra-curricular activities or clubs. There is no card playing or gambling allowed in Study Halls. Students may obtain a pass to the Library from the Librarians either the day before or the morning before the Study Hall period begins.



PASSES TO LEAVE CLASS

If you need to leave your classroom during the period for any reason, you should ask your teacher for a pass. The teacher will write and sign you a pass that will then be verified when you get to your destination.



BATHROOMS

Commack High School has bathrooms for student use in the following locations:

- 1st floor Boy's Rooms- Music wing, A-wing, B-wing, South Gym, E-wing by Weight Room, Cafeteria
- 2nd floor Boy's Rooms A-wing, B-wing, E-wing by Dance Studio
- 1st floor Girl's Rooms- Music wing, B-wing, South Gym, E-wing by Weight Room, Cafeteria
- 2nd floor Girl's Rooms B-wing, C-wing, E-wing by Dance Studio
- Single Stall Bathrooms 1st and 2nd floor E-wing by Computer Labs



CHROMEBOOKS

Every student at Commack High School has their own Chromebook for school use. The Chromebook should be brought to school each day and home each afternoon as you will need it at both places. Please treat the Chromebook like any other school-issued item and take care of it. If you have any issues with your Chromebook, our dedicated Instructional Technology staff is available to assist you.

HOMEROOM

Homeroom is a time for morning announcements, distributing school paperwork and taking daily attendance. Homeroom is scheduled daily from 7:30-7:36am.

BREAKFAST, LUNCH & THE CAFETERIA

FOOD SERVICE

Commack High School offers a "grab-and-go" breakfast program from 7:00-7:25am, as well as a full lunch service through our school caterer, Whitsons. Daily menus, special accommodations and information about payment can be found on the Whitsons page of the district website.



New barcode scanners have been placed in all of our school cafeterias to provide contact-free school lunch purchases. Students with mobile devices can download the Infinite Campus Student App to use their student id barcode. VENDING MACHINES

Vending machines are available in the Cafeteria and outside the E-wing entrance for student use. Students can purchase bottled drinks and small snacks from these machines.



SEATING

During the first week of school students will be asked to decide where they would like to sit in the Cafeteria and then remain in this seat for the remainder of the year. This ensures equity of seating as well as allows our lunch staff to account for students during the period.



LIBRARY PASSES

It is expected that students will remain in the Cafeteria for their entire lunch period. However, if a student would like to go to the Library they will need a pass/staff approval to do so. Passes can be obtained the day before or the morning of lunch from the receptionist in the Library.

NURSES' OFFICE

WHAT DOES THE NURSE DO?

Our Nurses are medical health professionals that care for our students and staff. We have three full-time Nurses here at Commack High School: Mrs. Dalton, Mrs. Gulino and Mrs. Wright. The Nurses are an integral part of our high school team. If you feel unwell throughout the school day, simply ask your teacher to see the Nurse. Your classroom teacher will provide you with a pass. The Nurse's office is located in the B-wing or "red wing" in the middle of the hallway. Students may visit the Nurse's office for a variety of reasons: to drop off paperwork, take medication, etc.

DISMISSAL FROM SCHOOL

EXITS

After the last bell, students are expected to exit the building unless they are staying after for an organized club/school activity or athletic practice/contest. Students may use any exterior door to exit the building. Students who are riding the bus will find buses in two rows in the front circle. There is an order that will be posted by the Main Lobby doors. Students who are being picked up can arrange for their ride to meet them in the Cafeteria lot on Townline Road.



LATE BUSES

For students who stay after and would like to take the late bus home, transportation will be available at 3:30 and 5:15. Bus stops are not the same as the daily buses; High School late buses are AA, BB, CC or DD. Late Buses leave from the front circle. Stops for each route are posted by the South Gym, E-wing doors, A-wing doors, C-wing doors and in the Main Lobby.



SPACES AVAILABLE AFTER-SCHOOL

It is expected that any students who remain in the building after dismissal, do so for extra-help, extra-curricular activity or athletics. Additionally, the following spaces are available to students to complete school work from 2:30-3;15pm:



- Library
- Cafeteria
- Computer Lab 2/3
