Course Description

This course is designed for students who have passed the Algebra 1 and Geometry courses. The best preparation for further math courses and college success is a good foundation in algebra. This course will provide a solid foundation for those students who struggled in Algebra and will continue on to Algebra 2. The Intermediate Algebra course includes a full development of functions and their graphs, the exponential function, the logarithmic function, a review and extension of quadratics, complex numbers, and the real number system.

Expectations

- 1) Be seated *before* the bell rings
- 2) Come to class prepared (bring notebook, pens/pencils, calculator, homework)
- 3) Be responsible for missed work (be able to contact a classmate) and exams

I expect that you will do everything that you can to make sure that you understand what you are learning. This means being focused and attentive in class, being willing to ask questions, and doing all homework and classwork. As mature young people, I also expect that each of you will be respectful to one another and to myself.

Supplies

- 4) Graphing Calculator TI-83, TI-83 Plus, TI-84, or TI-84 Plus

If a student is unable to purchase a calculator they may borrow one from the high school library. The student will be responsible for any damage and/or the loss or theft of the calculator.

Grade Calculation

A student's grade for this course will be determined in the following manner:

1) Tests & Quizzes (80%)

A quiz and test will be given for each unit of study.

2) Homework/participation (20%)

Expect homework to be assigned daily. All assignments must be neatly written with the HW# and date on it.

Absences

In the event of an absence, **students are responsible** to make up all classwork, homework, notes and exams. To avoid receiving a grade of zero, students are to make up missed test/quizzes in a timely manner contingent upon the number of days they were absent. Notes are saved to my One Drive which can be found on my Teacher Page.
